Most parents and other adults read it to their children for fun. 21, Edward Glaeser, an economics professor, uses it 22 a financial (財務) teaching material to teach financial literacy to youth. He believes that 23 storybooks can help children manage their money wisely.

24 children basic financial skills is important because with the development of electronic payments in the world, people 25 spend more than they have and get into debt. The challenge is 26 to make learning about finance more fun. *Education Weekly* suggests various interesting resources, such as fairy tales, or games.

Daniel Britton, a British writer, has written several financial stories. *The Magic Magpie*, 27, is a story of a brother and sister using very different approaches to manage money and life. *The ant and the Grasshopper* clarify workable investment behavior. *Supermarket Sweep* 28 questions and answers through the story of going to the supermarket.

Games are also a great way to teach financial principles. *Monopoly*, a board game, teaches children not to be weak in business 29. *Game of Life* shows key financial decisions. *MyBank* asks questions like, "If you saved NT50 every day from the age of fourteen in a savings account with 8% interest, you'd saved 5 million by the age of 65. True or False?"

These financial fairy tales or games share the values, habits, tools and skills for financial success and 30 learning about money fun for kids.

Want to help clean up the ocean? Then you might want to say goodbye to glitter. That's what 19 preschools in the United Kingdom did last year. Now scientists are exploring the idea of a bigger ban to help reduce the amount of microplastics that leak into waterways. These tiny pieces of plastic easily wash down drains (下水道) and are not usually caught by filters.

Once the plastic particles(微粒)are in the ocean, marine animals like seabirds, plankton, and shellfish often mistake them for food. Sean Anderson, a professor at California State University, is following microplastics up the food chain to see how they affect humans. It's too soon to say. But Anderson thinks awareness about the issue will have a big impact. "It's unlikely we'll be able to clean up the oceans with all the stuff that's in there," he said. "We need to be focusing on not making the problem any worse."

Nao the robot is two feet tall. It has light-up eyes. It speaks in a childlike voice. Also he grabs students' attention. Yet, the scientists are still not sure how long the students will be interested in it. They need at least six months to decide if kids stay engaged.

Of course, robot tutors will need to do much more than keep kids' attention. Scientists are working to build robots that can tell when a student is confused and adjust the lesson to help.

In fact, robots are closer than ever to being able to do just that. Lipson, a robotics professor at Columbia University says, "Computers can finally understand what they're seeing. They can tell if you're smiling. They can tell if you're looking at the screen." Though it may sound spooky, this is new. It happened in the past two or three years, thanks to machine learning. "You show the computer hundreds of thousands of examples," Lipson says. "It analyzes the examples. It learns from them."

Lipson expects to see more of this technology built into robots. He says a good human teacher is best. But he points out that by using robots too, we might just be able to give many more kids their own private tutor.

We are taught not to waste food but what about food dropped on the floor? Many people rely on something called the five-second rule. The rule claims that fallen food is safe to eat if it has been on the floor for five seconds or less. Can people really count on the five-second rule?

According to some researchers, the five-second rule is not always reliable. In some instances, bacteria can transfer to food in less than a second. Sticky, wet food—like a licked candy or a slice of watermelon—will absorb bacteria as soon as it hits the floor. Even if the food is picked up quickly, it should not be eaten.

What if you drop food on the kitchen counter? As a matter of fact, that's a big no-no because kitchen counters may contain more harmful bacteria because of the raw foods, which may have bacteria called salmonella. People could get very sick if they eat off a surface that has salmonella.

With the five-second rule, much depends on the type of food and the surface on which it falls. So it might be best to rely on this rule instead: When in doubt, throw it out.
