2. Want to Be an Astronaut? NASA Could Be Looking for You

The U.S. space agency NASA is seeking candidates to be future astronauts, who will help with the plan to send the first woman and the next man to the moon as part of its Artemis program. Artemis aims to return humans to the moon by 2024. NASA says it expects to choose the final candidates in the middle of 2021. They will then immediately begin training to become Artemis Generation astronauts.

Two general requirements are that applicants must be U.S. citizens and hold a master's degree in a field related to science, technology, engineering or mathematics, or STEM. This master's requirement can also be met with the completion of at least two years of a STEM PhD program, or by finishing a test pilot school program. A medical degree will also be accepted.

Of course, all applicants will have to complete a NASA physical examination to test their fitness for long-term spaceflight. And, for the first time, all candidates will also need to take an internet-based test. The pay for a beginning astronaut is officially listed at between \$105,000 and \$161,000 a year. Astronaut Warren Hoburg advises that "The three things it takes to be an astronaut are technical skill, operational skills, and then just being fun and easy to be around."
