

Pay toilets have a long history dating back to ancient Roman times, during which individuals would pay to use public restrooms. Even today, pay toilets can be found in various places worldwide. These facilities require a small entry fee, and it helps to ensure their maintenance. Let's see how different countries or cities deal with the issue of pay toilets.

In Taiwan, public restrooms for women at railway and bus stations, as well as in traditional markets, used to charge a fee because they provided toilet paper, while men's restrooms were free to use. This practice clearly went against sexual equality and was later stopped. Today, most public toilets in Taiwan are free of charge, and an increasing number of them are beginning to offer free toilet paper.

In the Czech Republic, restrooms generally charge a fee, and this is also common in subway stations. Besides, some stores print bathroom codes on the receipt.
